CITATION REQUIREMENTS

To earn an American Cultures Scholars Citation, you must model good community citizenship and complete 19 credits with a minimum cumulative grade point average of 3.0 in all courses at UM during the two-year period of the Scholars Program. If you are exempt from ENGL 101, you must complete 16 credits. These credits must be satisfied during the two-year period of the Scholars Program (4 semesters). All students are expected to comply with the University's Code of Academic Integrity. ***Please note: CPSP 318 has replaced CPSP 259R as an option for the final semester.**
