CITATION REQUIREMENTS

To earn a Business, Society, and Economy (BSE) Scholars Citation, you must model good community citizenship and complete 17-18 credits with a minimum cumulative grade point average of 3.0 in all courses at UM during the two-year period of the Scholars Program. If you are exempt from ENGL 101, you must complete 17 credits. These credits must be satisfied during the two-year period of the Scholars Program (4 semesters). All students are expected to comply with the University's Code of Academic Integrity.
