CITATION REQUIREMENTS

To earn an Environment, Technology, and Economy Scholars Citation, you must model good community citizenship and complete 16-18 credits from specified courses during the two-year program. (If you are exempt from ENGL 101, you must complete 13-15 credits.) You must earn a minimum grade point average of 3.0 in the Scholars ETE citation courses **and** a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.5 in all courses at UM during the two-year period of the Scholars Program. These credits must be satisfied during the two-year Scholars Program (4 semesters). All students are expected to comply with the University's Code of Academic Integrity.
