CITATION REQUIREMENTS

To earn a Public Leadership Scholars Citation, you must model good community citizenship and complete 15 credits with a minimum cumulative grade point average of 3.0 in all courses at UM during the two-year period of the Scholars Program (4 semesters). If you are exempt from ENGL 101, you must complete 12 credits. These credits must be satisfied during the two-year period of the Scholars Program.
